
I got the insurance money and went hunting for a new car.

The two-deck ferry Roseville offered cruises to Roseville Pier and Ballroom for an evening of dancing on the Point Loma peninsula.












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Ron Howard-Then and Now.

During the filming of "American Graffiti" (1973), Ron Howard faced an unexpected challenge. In a late-night scene where he was supposed to smoothly drive his 1958 Chevy Impala down Modesto's neon-lit streets, the car suddenly stalled. Instead of breaking character, he instinctively stayed in the moment, keeping his hands on the wheel and reacting naturally. George Lucas, always in favor of authenticity, decided to keep the take, capturing Howard's real frustration and turning it into a believable part of Steve Bolander's character. It was a small but telling moment that showcased Howard's ability to blend into Lucas's vision of a raw, youthful, and unfiltered night in 1962.

Howard, known at the time primarily for his role as Opie Taylor in "The Andy Griffith Show," saw "American Graffiti" as an opportunity to shed his child-actor image and transition into

> more mature roles. Playing Steve Bolander, the confident and slightly arrogant high school senior is torn between staying with his girlfriend Laurie (Cindy Williams) or leaving for college.

She did not want him to go, got angry and jumped into the black car.

Unlike the carefully scripted performances of television, Lucas encouraged improvisation and spontaneity.

In the Drag race, Steve followed after his girl who had climbed into the black car.

The two drivers dare each other to race and they take off.

The Black car goes out of control and crashes on fire.

Steve runs to his girl. She's ok. They make up and he does not go off to College.

Lucas treats the kids as real people doing what real kids do. Great movie.

50/50 Drawing: no drawing. Name tag drawing: No winner.




























Hollywood Icons

Memories with my 1934 Ford

How I received my '34 Tudor Sedan

In 1983 I received a call out of the blue from my Great Aunt Em (Grandma's sister) asking if I wanted her 1934 Tudor Sedan. She was moving out of the city (Chicago) and wasn't taking the car with her. At that time, she had been driving a 1973 Camaro, since 1973. When she called, I immediately said yes, and rounded up a trailer and my older brother and set off for Chicago from Gary, IN to pick up the car.



I had never dreamed she would call me; as there are a number of cousins senior to me that were in line for the Ford. They had all turned her down and told her their various reasons they couldn't pick it up. I had ridden in the car for years with her to the family plot at the cemetery and there was always a bushel basket, gloves and gardening tools in the basket

This car has family history as my Aunt Em had purchased it used in 1938 for \$165 dollars, several old timers told me she overpaid. My parents went to their 1944 prom and had 2 flats and didn't get home until the next day. A story retold many times over the years, with a lot of laughter.

When I picked up the car, I didn't have the resources to begin a restoration so stored the car until I met and married the most understanding woman. The 1934 V8 was re-



from the history books? Michelin built this 10-wheeled machine back in 1972 to use as a test vehicle for the company's commercial tires. The custom Citroen's official name is "Poids Lourd Rapide," which loosely translates to "fast truck" or "heavy weight fast" in English. The Citroen PLR, as unique as it is, carries many other nicknames such as the Citroen Centipede, the Mille Pattes, or simply "the Michelin test car."

The truck tire tester weighs in at over ten tons and is capable of 500 horsepower with 11 tires touching the ground. It was able to test commercial truck tires at 110 miles-per-hour. Inside the nearly 23-foot-long elongated body is a contraption that accommodates the larger 11th tire, the main test subject and the hidden secret of the Citroen PLR.





