


With so many local men off to serve our country, women took on organizing efforts for supplies and funds during the war years including scrap drives, setting up safety homes, raising money for hospitals, and finding ways to cut expenses for families. The American Women's Voluntary Services (A.W.V.S.) was founded nearly two years before the attack on Pearl Harbor. It was the largest women's service organization in the country during WWII. Based on a similar British organization, the A.W.V.S. provided a broad range of services to the armed forces throughout the war. This meeting of several officers of the Coronado branch was likely taken in 1944. Left to right: Mrs. Tom Peck, Mrs. Donald Spicer, Mrs. Lefta Labby, Miss Marcia Warren, Mrs. Patterson (first chairman) and Mrs. W.W. Crosby. The woman who is not in uniform, 3rd from the left in the photo, is Emma Jessop Scripps.

Scrap Metal Drives took place on the corner of Palm and D Avenue. Everyone donated scrap to be converted to war weapons. This '36 Ford arrived loaded with chrome accessories and left, stripped to it's skin, looking a little naked, but proud.



Bonneville/land-speed racing

Goldenrod's golden anniversary & Big Merc Van-O-Rama



Thursday marked the 50th anniversary of the land-speed record set by the Summers brothers in their Goldenrod: 409.277 MPH for a wheel-driven, naturally aspirated-engine vehicle. To mark the occasion, The Henry Ford – current caretakers of the Goldenrod – pulled together its photos and files on the record-holder.

Lately there's been a photo making the rounds of a Maserati in the back of a glass-walled truck on the highway. Impressive, but Mercury did the exact same thing for its XM-Turnpike Cruiser concept car 60 years ago, as The Old Motor showed us recently.--Daniel Strohl





1937 Ford powered Hunt House Car with First Working RV Shower

Early motorhomes offered more style and amenities than you may realize. Have a look at this Hunt House Car with

its unique design and working shower!

If you have spent an extended period of time traveling for work then you probably know the damage not having a place of your own does to you over time. An acclaimed Hollywood cinematographer named J. Roy Hunt had a similar issue. His chosen profession kept him away from home for weeks at a time. Over the years J. Roy

Hunt decided to bring his home along with him during these travels. He ended up with several "Hunt Cars", his first being built in 1935 and the last in 1945. Perhaps one of the most notorious is the Hunt House Car from 1937.

The Hunt house car used a 1937 Ford truck chassis & flathead V8.. J. Roy Hunt was able to use aircraft engineering to build the streamlined body you see in the photos. He had a auto-body shop help him with the fabrication. Hunt built almost 50 of them over the next decade, making it one of the rarest production motorhomes in existence and considered by many to be the first with a working shower. It also featured a disappearing toilet that folds into the wall so the shower has additional space.

A high flat-topped hood dominated the front look of the 1940 model, as the grille spread out to reach the fenders to differentiate the Deluxe line and the headlights were pushed wider still. The standard Ford inherited the grille of the 1939 model with blackout on each side of a heavy chrome center; heavier headlight surrounds serve as another major differentiator from the 1939.

Sealed-beam headlights were one of the few major advances for 1940, and a hydraulic top was new on the convertible.


