



Into The Wild Blue Yonder-Oct 8


At the Gillespie V8 Tour auction, Gary Timm & I went head to head for a ride in Stu Macphearson's '29 Steerman design Bi-Plane made by TravelAir. Auctioneer, Bill Lewis played us out, seeing who would fold first. When it became clear neither of us was going to quit before mortgaging our homes, they settled the standoff by offering two rides. I got the first.

While walking to the plane, my son, Mike, and I, couldn't stop ourselves from playing the Top Gun scene, "I feel the need for speed" -high five and

all. After gearing up with official goggles and leather helmets, we shoehorned our butts into the front seat. Stu finished his check list and took over the pilot's seat behind. I asked Stu, How many hours do you get on the engine before a rebuild? He answered, "1,200". So how many on there now? He smiled, "About 1,300."

We taxied slowly onto the runway. The Tower gave us the 'Go' and 38 feet later we were airborne. We headed west across the foothills, past Soledad and the smaller valleys that feed into Mission Valley, across Mission Bay to the sparkling Pacific where it was so clear we could see Japan. Whenever we pointed something out, Stu banked over so we could get shots of the scenery. Over the beach he stood the plane on it's wingtip and spun us around to begin our run north along the coast. Earlier in the day, he had been out there following ten gray whales headed south, but we just saw surfers, wave runners and along Torrey Pine cliffs, hang gliders leaping into the updrafts. He brought us down to about 50 feet to see if any naked bathers were lying around on Black's Beach (No luck). At Del Mar Stu gave us a loop de loop and several figure 8 wing stands which was worth the trip right there. Headed back east we cruised

The Pink Lady, still popular -45 years later.

In the early 20th century, a drive through the hills above Los Angeles on a bright sunny day afforded scenic vistas and mountain breezes. But for motorists entering the narrow 1910 Newhall Tunnel, a sudden transition into darkness set hearts pounding as eyes adjusted to the tunnel's inky interior. This 1937 photo catches a Chevy Cabriolet about to enter the

abyss. Several tunnels were cut through the hills to improve traffic flow. But in 1966 a 60 foot tall naked lady suddenly appeared above the Malibu Canyon Tunnel. She was painted by one Lynne Seemayer, a 31-year old local artist (and evidently quite a daredevil). Seemayer spent several nights removing unsightly graffitti before painting the running nude. The local press dubbed the painting "The Pink Lady", and she became a popular free-spirit symbol for residents. But, officials wanted her removed, claiming she was a distraction for passing drivers. She existed for only five days before she was painted over by Los

Angeles County maintenance workers. For some time after the painting was removed, Seemayer received <u>hate mail</u> and <u>phone calls</u> from people who felt the work was

obscene, including threats of violence against her. She also received a few offers from art galleries to show her work.- Excerpts from Wikipedia

In addition to seeing John at CHRR, we had four other friends racing their nostalgia front engine dragsters, two in the NE1 class, and two in 7.0 Pro. Our friend from Brownsburg, Indiana towed his dragster to Bakersfield to run the 7.0 Pro class and qualified in the first round with a near perfect time, 7.00 with a 9. In the second



round he encountered mechanical problems and he didn't qualify to move ahead. If you like drag racing CHRR is the place to be!! Ask John about his times- (he usually runs under 8 sec in the 120s), Pretty good for an old geezer (the car I mean) - Joe Pifer





Riot at Ford Plant. Men throw stones, police retreat.

March, 1931 When it came to building cars, there's no question Henry Ford revolutionized the business, but during the depths of the Great Depression, the slow economic recovery made possible by New Deal programs, suffered a setback. At that time some 70,000 men were working at the Ford Dearborn factory. But 1,300 who did not work there, and wanted to, gathered on a Detroit street corner. Quietly they began marching to the River Rouge plant to ask for jobs. At the Dearborn city line their number had doubled, their

quietude had yielded to aggressiveness. Fifty Dearborn police tried to turn them back. Out from the mob burst a woman, crying: "Come on, you cowards!" Police went down under a hail of bricks, stones, clubs. Firemen and Detroit police hurried to their aid with tear gas bombs and high pressure hoses. On to the factory gate pressed the mob. There it was met by two volleys of high-aimed pistol fire and forced back. As the crowd reformed, Henry Ford's favorite thug, Service Chief Harry H. Bennett, drove into its midst. In an instant his car was toppled over. Someone cried: "Save him!" The police fired point blank into the crowd. Twenty men fell, the rest scattered. Fifty lay injured on the skirmish field, including Bennett and many policemen. Four rioters were dead.

The Riot headlines faded over the next few years and the assembly lines kept moving. However, pressure was building from the UAW to unionize. Henry hated the unions and sent Harry Bennett and his gang of Servicemen to do the necessary dirty work to thwart the worker's goals.

In 1937, the public took a liking to the modern styling on the new Ford line, featuring a more rounded look with fine horizontal bars in the convex front and hood-side grilles. Bennett continued to solidify the bond of trust between himself and Mr. Ford - even to the point of pushing family members out of leadership positions. Ford stayed focussed on the brisk sales totals - because the bottom line was what counted. -Excerpts from Wikipedia-----



Burbank Firefighters had their hands full when they arrived on scene at 3316 W. Verdugo Avenue, Thursday afternoon. The garage was well involved with fire. The 91 year-old occupant was knocked to the ground after attempting to start the car and it backfired and caught fire. Firefighters made a quick knock down but were unable to save the garage or any of it's contents which included a 1940 Ford Coupe and a mobile trailer sitting near the garage. Firefighter/ Paramedics treated the resident, Tom Medley, the owner of both the home and of the car. Medley declined any further medical treatment. Burbank Fire sent three engines, two truck companies, a paramedic unit and Battalion Chief, Assistant Chief Tom Lenahan. The damage was listed at \$90,000 with no injuries to firefighters.-Kirk Jones
