

Prized Ford F-100 pickup stolen from L.A. recovered after 38 years

SAN FRANCISCO — Harold Voelker tucked away the ownership title and memories of his prized 1956 Ford F-100 pickup after it was stolen in 1972 in Los Angeles.

Both were dusted off when authorities told Voelker they had found the vehicle in Modesto—38 years after it went missing.

"I go to car shows all the time, and I thought, I'm going to see it one of these days," Voelker, 63, said Thursday. "That was my baby."

Voelker retrieved the pickup Tuesday after it was discovered last week.

The California Highway Patrol said officials noticed a discrepancy in the vehicle identification number when a Modesto couple tried to register the truck after getting it from a relative in Texas, who didn't know it had been stolen.

CHP Officer Greg Bennett found the original identification number and contacted Voelker, questioning him about the truck and where he had lived when it was stolen.

"He kept quizzing and quiz-

zing, and Ianswered everything," Voelker said. "He said, 'Guess what, I have your truck sitting here.' I said, 'Is this a joke?'"

Bennett said it was an unusual discovery.

"There's definite gratification in getting this guy his truck back, absolutely," he said.

Even so, Bennett called the case bittersweet, because the Modesto couple lost the truck.

Voelker said the truck is running well and seems to have more power than he remembered.

There were some changes, however. Voelker said it was pale yellow when it was stolen but is now white. It also has alloy wheels, which Voelker plans to replace with original stainless-steel hubcaps.

He also intends to install a theft alarm and park the truck in his garage.

"I'm thinking about getting plates that say, 'Back Home,' or 'It's Back,' "he said.

Ford V-8 woody from the early Thirties, not that there's anything wrong with such an item. You looked it over, though, and realized it was different. RM Auctions, debuting its Auctions America sale last weekend in Auburn, Indiana, was offering this custom woody, with three rows of seats, built on a 1934 one-ton V-8 truck chassis. Its first owner was a musician from Cincinnati from Cincinnati by the name of Leonard Slye. He bought this truck to take his Western swing band, the O-Bar-O Cowboys, on tour throughout the Southwest, having earlier moved from Ohio



to Los Angeles. That led to radio dates and Slye then fronted a new band, the Sons of the Pioneers, which probably used this very Ford. Within a year, Slye was appearing in films as a singing cowboy. He soon adopted the stage name that made him a music icon, Roy Rogers. This Ford, offered without reserve, sold for \$27,500.

On Sunday Sept. 19th, EFV8 members John and Pat Hildebrand took their 1931 Ford Coupe hot rod to the Barona drag strip for the 39th annual "Antique Drags." Joining John and Pat were EFV8 President Barbara Martin and her husband Dick as well as Rick and Betty Stores, Rick Carlton and others. They all enjoyed good food, friends and a day full of racing. John's car had the honor of being chosen as one of the two poster and T-shirt cars. The track was filled with over 100 1972 and older cars, hotrods roadsters, dragsters and "run-what-ya-brung" cars.

The racing started at 8am with John's Coupe racing against the other poster car, a 1966 Chevelle driven by Eddie Barcello Jr. With near identical reaction times (John's .056 to Eddie's .049) the race was close but John's 6.429 ET wasn't enough for Eddie's 580 cubic inch alcohol injected big-block Chevelle with 6.224 ET. Racing continued throughout the day with some cars making many passes. Right after lunch, John and Eddie had another go at it. John cut a sensational .010 reaction time with Eddie close behind at .022. This time Eddie overpowered the track and John won with a 6.892 to the Chevelle's out-of-shape 13.401

John has been racing in the Antique drags since 1995, first at Carlsbad and now at Barona. He raced his 1931

Model "A" truck for many years and won the Pro bracket trophy at the very last race at Carlsbad in August 2004. John has been participating in the Summit equipment sponsored Pro bracket series at Barona. He finished 4th in points in 2009 and raced in the divisional "Race of Champions" in Phoenix last year. This year John finished 8th in points in the Pro bracket.

The Antique drags are a chance for anyone to bring their 1972 and older car out for a fun time. You can see stock model "A"s to muscle cars having a go at the track. With the smell of rubber and the sound of open exhausts it's often more fun than a Marx brothers' movie and just as wild. Go to http://baronadrags.com and click on Photos. Remembering the bad old good times.

1930s--During the decade the cars we love were being built, America was in it's deepest depression. Dirt-poor farmers were escaping from the dust bowl in any rattle-trap that would run. They lived off the land on the side of the road. Dorothy Lang chronicled the plight of the families moving west where rumors of plentiful jobs and food you could pluck off trees fueled the migration. Her photos record the awful truth of despair and disillusionment. Fortunately, over the years, folks seem to forget the worst of times, focusing instead on the family triumphs that got them through the whole darn mess.

In 1929 my Grandfather, Lou, a widower with a infectious sense of humor, packed his two daughters, age eleven (my mom), her seven year old sister, and his meager belongings in a \$15 dollar Ford. The reason - a determined woman down at the Book Bindery wanted to marry him in the worst way. His escape became a memorable ride of mechanical mishaps and neighborly rescues from Chicago to San Diego. In telling the tale, Lou would get to laughing so hard he had to slap his knee and yell, "Hot Diggity." I heard the stories often about the Ford's lights failing so the girls laid out on the fenders with flashlights to guide them to camp spots, but they were

giggling so hard they couldn't keep the lights on the trail. And eating so many oranges in Orange county that they all got the skidaddles. And having a fellow stop to help them with a flat on the way to town, and the same guy help them again with a second flat on the way home. At times they were hungry and near disparate, but somehow a kind stranger would appear to save them so they could continue on and laugh about it later--TS

CARB Tire inflation Regulations 9/1/2010

On August 31, 2010 the California Office of Administrative Law (OAL) approved a final regulatory order issued by California Air Resources Board (CARB) entitled: Regulations to Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Vehicles Operating with Under Inflated Tires. The new regulation was approved with an early implementation date of tomorrow, Sept. 1, 2010. WHO IS AFFECTED: The regulation applies to all automotive services providers, defined as "any business or government or private vehicle fleet maintenance provider that performs or offers to perform automotive maintenance or repair service".

CAN A SERVICE PROVIDER CHARGE FOR THE SERVICE: Yes, if they provide a written estimate first, just like any other service.

VEHICLE WITH A GVWR EXCEEDING 10,000 LBS: Exempt

PENALTIES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE: An automotive service provider that fails to comply with the regulations is punishable by fines up to \$25,000 and nine months imprisonment if the violation was the result of negligence and up to \$75,000 and one year imprisonment if the
